Cristina Galietto, Guitar

Cristina Galietto is a classical guitarist from Naples, Italy. She is highly regarded for her strong stage presence, her stylistic versatility and her mellow tone, skilfully combining technical virtuosity with a natural musicality. Her artistry appeals equally to diverse audiences and cultures.

Her debut album 'Avant l'Aube' (Timespan Recordings, 2020) features works by Joaquín Rodrigo, Domenico Scarlatti and Alexis Rago, highlighting her sensitivity to both historical and modern repertoire.

Cristina Galietto has performed as a soloist, with chamber music ensembles and as a soloist with orchestras throughout Europe, the UK, the USA and China. She has appeared at festivals and venues such as Kings Place (London), the Théâtre Traversière (Paris), the Lockenhaus Chamber Music Festival and the Tenri Cultural Institute in New York. She has also undertaken extensive tours of China. In Italy, she has performed at events including the Paganini Guitar Festival, Segovia Guitar Week and the Festival del '700 Napoletano in the Sala dei Baroni of the Maschio Angioino.

She began her training at the age of seven with her father Alberto and soon went on to win numerous international competitions. Highlights of her career include EuroStrings 2021 (Petrer), the Uppsala Guitar Competition and the Andrés Segovia Competition (Monheim am Rhein). In 2021, she was awarded the 'Golden Guitar' at the International Guitar Meeting in Milan.

Cristina holds three master's degrees in classical guitar, most recently from the University of Music and Performing Arts Graz, where she studied concert performance with Paolo Pegoraro and Łukasz Kuropaczewski. She plays a guitar by Alessandro Marseglia and maintains a regular international concert schedule.

Cristina Galietto uniquely combines her early career accolades with extensive touring experience, a keen sense for putting together stylistically diverse programmes, and the ability to connect meaningfully with both the audience and her fellow musicians.
